

Aging in a Digital World Poster Abstract Submission Guidelines

Preparing the Poster Abstract

Poster abstract submissions are limited to 500 words or 2,300 characters, not including spaces, the title, or the author block. Please provide grant funding information at the bottom of the abstract. Do not include tables, charts, or graphs and do not use brand names.

Title: Titles are limited to 15 words maximum and in title case format. *Example:* Phase Shifts the Circadian Clock in Aging Individuals

Authors: Include the first and last names of the authors. Do not include degrees or titles, but do cite departmental and university affiliations. *Example:* George A. Brooks, Integrative Biology, UC, Berkeley

Institutions: Include the institutions of all the authors.

Select the category that represents the intended focus of your abstract:

- □ New models of care and health promotion for older adults and family caregivers.
- □ Challenges to implementing new models of care and health promotion for older adults and family caregivers.
- □ Technology development for aging populations.
- □ Novel methods for clinical research and innovation for aging and technology.
- Evidence-based digital health solutions for older adults in all care settings, including the home.
- □ Relevant public policy issues.

Text:

Abstracts are informative and include a statement of the study's specific PURPOSE, METHODS, summary of RESULTS, and CONCLUSION (using these headings). It is unsatisfactory to state, "The results will be discussed."

Abstract content and editing are the responsibility of the submitting author. Abstracts of experimental studies must include data to substantiate the conclusions being drawn. The lack of inclusion of experimental data may result in the abstract being rejected.

The abstract must be written in English.
